I had the opportunity to travel to the US and visit Florida, New York and Connecticut while I was a teenager. My father's best friend was an awesome Canadian man that lived in Winsted Connecticut and for this reason I was very familiar with American culture.

I met my sweet amazing husband at the age of 17 while he was serving a mission in Costa Rica and we got married 2
