Mariel Amundsen-Immigrant Story

Mariel Amundsen lives in Mount Vernon, Washington. Mariel was invited to present during the October 4, 2022, WIN membership meeting to share a presentation about Tinikling – Filipino traditional folk dance.

Mariel joined Washington State Employment Security Department (ESD) in May 2022, as an Administrative Assistant supporting the WorkSource North Sound Region – Skagit, Whatcom, and Island counties. Prior to joining ESD, she was an Administrative Assistant to a handful of medical directors for Optum Care and was a Technical Assistant and Logistics Representative for a local aerospace company. She also previously worked at Rolls-Royce of North America for 14-years.



Mariel is due to graduate from Southern New Hampshire University to obtain her bachelor's degree in general studies with a focus in Human Resources.

On October 2, 1990, Mariel set to fly to San Francisco, California for a better future for herself and her 12-year-old brother. She shared that her first impression when arriving to the United States were all positive and that she heard different languages being spoken as she walked through the terminal. She also shared that almost everyone was translated into different languages in case they did not speak English. She was "amazed" and felt there were opportunities for her and her brother in the U.S. She was determined to become a U.S. citizen.
